Every child is able to develop their movement, skill, balance and coordination as well as self confidence. Teaching is planned in relation to the progression of skills for each year group and against the core skills. Each child is given the opportunity to develop their competitive skills by engaging in competitive sports in school. Year 3, 4 and Year 5 have participated in competitive sports with other schools including football, tri golf, hockey, rugby and dance. To support these opportunities we purchase specialised equipment and resources.</p> <p>The impact of this teaching has allowed all children to access PE opportunities and try new skills and sports.</p> <p>16 children from Lower Key Stage 2 had the opportunity to take part in a Tri golf after school club in the Spring term, which was delivered by a trainer golf instructor and KS2 teaching staff used this as a CPD opportunity. The children gained new skills and techniques for golf, as well as developing their confidence to try a new sport.</p> <p>CVPS was awarded the Sainsbury's School Games Silver Award. This award is in recognition of the work we undertake around school sport and the opportunities that we provide our children.</p> <p>20 pupils from Y4 have been supported to attend a residential activity centre with strong opportunities for problem solving and active learning with archery, canoeing, stream walking, a giant swing, piranha pool to name just a few.</p> <p>Activities delivered have included boot camp, hula hooping, dance club, performing arts clubs, youth club, martial arts,</p>

KS2 staff used the Tri Golf coaching as a CPD opportunity to develop their skills and knowledge of the sport. These training opportunities had a positive impact on staff by increasing their confidence, up levelling their skills and allowing them to see a variety of teaching strategies. Staff have been using the core skill tasks in their lessons, which have given a great structure and progression of learning in PE lessons across school.</p> <p>Outdoor learning opportunities also allow children to learn new skills and build fitness and resilience in an outdoor environment. We receive support from specialised forest school instructors to enhance the children's learning and knowledge. A review took place of the outdoor learning programme offered by the school. New schemes of work have incorporated pupil voice into the programme and allowed staff to plan together so that pupils are following more project based learning. Pupil engagement levels have been much better. Pupils now take an active part in contributing ideas,</p>

			which has led to stronger engagement from them during the sessions. Additionally we provide a healthy lifestyle programme which creates a greater awareness of issues such as the need for exercise, health living, tackling obesity and healthy eating.

As a school we also look to provide children with the chance to join local clubs and organisations, and have developed sporting links with a local Hockey club. As a result of this a fifth of the class from Year 5 have joined an outside Hockey club based in Newcastle.  We now have a link with The Cramlington Coordinator, Gillian Marsden, who gives regular updates, advice and support.  Our future focus is to further develop the teaching of PE and deliver a broader and balanced programme, as well as extending the extra curricular learning opportunities which will be linked to the wider curriculum in order to enhance learning for all participants. As CVPS, for the first time, will have a full KS2, we can use all of the opportunities available to us.

### Planning statement (2017-2018)

**The Government's Primary PE and Sport Funding (£8,815) will be used to join the Cramlington School Sport Partnership, who will provide the following:**
