The playground leaders support this initiative and take ownership for specific tasks each day. Some of the organised games and sports include hula hooping, skipping, football and tennis. The hula hooping festival, the tennis taster session and skipping festival, which were offered by the Cramlington Partnership have support CPD needs in staff. |

Apply to join the partnership for 2018-2019 | Regular contact between Gillian Marsden and Nicole Weatheritt has enabled CVPS to participate in many sporting opportunities this year. CVPS has offered a broader programme to all of the children, as well as extending the extra curricular learning opportunities for KS2. This year staff have been more involved in PE teaching and coordinating events. Teachers have been more aware of PE assessment when choosing children for the competitions. Achievements and participation in events are recognised in Celebration assembly on a Friday, in front of the school. Children who attend outside clubs are also encouraged to bring in their awards to show and demonstrate their skills. |
| To improve outdoor learning facilities | Yurt - Cost £7,385 | To create a stimulating outdoor learning environment To use the Yurt for a mixture of cross curricular subjects | At CVPS outdoor learning is important allowing children to learn new skills and build fitness and resilience in an outdoor environment. We receive support from specialised forest school instructors to enhance the children's learning and knowledge. A review took place of the outdoor learning programme offered by the school. New schemes of work have incorporated pupil voice into the programme and allowed staff to plan together so that pupils are following more project based learning. Pupil engagement levels have been much better. Pupils now take an active part in contributing ideas, which has led to stronger engagement from them during the sessions. Additionally we provide a healthy lifestyle programme which creates a greater awareness of issues such as the need for exercise, health living, tackling obesity and healthy eating. The Yurt has given the children a sheltered outside place to learn in and participate in lessons such as Music, Yoga, Forest school and clubs. |

Planning statement (2018-2019)

The Government's Primary PE and Sport Funding (£8,815) will be used to renew our membership in the Cramlington School Sport Partnership, who will provide the following:

- CPD opportunities in PE/ sport for teachers across the school through the Cramlington School Sport Partnership
